

Context

Since its foundation in 1844 the Spanish Guardia Civil has been participating in the resolution of the main security issues affecting Spain as a State at national and international level. The experience gained over these years, and especially the know-how with integrity and spirit of service to citizens is becoming increasingly of interests as a benchmark for other law enforcement agencies, and required by international bodies such as the EU, which supports the development of institutional strengthening and stability projects in our external borders and other geopolitical scenarios.
